APPLIED CIMS (CIMS4)

ABOUT THIS COURSE

The Coordinated Incident Management System (CIMS) provides the model or structure for the command, control and coordination of an emergency response. All New Zealand emergency response agencies are mandated by central government to use this incident management system. CIMS is increasingly finding greater importance in a range of industry applications and qualifications.

The SARINZ Applied CIMS training is designed to equip personnel with the knowledge and skills required to apply the principles of CIMS to an incident or emergency response of any kind. Our CIMS4 course is interactive, practically focused and covers all of the elements of CIMS2 (US17279) and CIMS 4 (US29553 & 29554) and has received positive feedback from corporate event management organisations, NZ Transport Association, Transport Operations Centres, the extractive industry, numerous government agencies, corporate bodies and NGO's as well as our core clients in Civil Defence, Police, Fire Service, District Health Boards, LandSAR and Rural Fire. COURSE OUTCOMES

The overall objective of the course is to instill an understanding of the principles, structure and operation of CIMS in New Zealand. By the end of this course you should be able to;

- Demonstrate knowledge of the interrelated functions of the CIMS model;
- Demonstrate knowledge of Control function responsibilities and describe other Incident Management Team (IMT) function manager roles;
- Demonstrate knowledge of the Action Plan process in an incident;
- Gain and convey situational awareness;
- Produce and update an Action Plan in an incident; and
- Demonstrate appropriate communication skills in an incident.

The course contains requires participants to work together in small syndicates to perform as members of an Incident Management Team (IMT) to manage response efforts to a range of scenarios and at a range of levels.

STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT

TRAINING PROGRAMME

Pre-workshop:

Consists of some reading and/or exercises for those without prior experience of incident management or CIMS knowledge.

Workshop:

Consists of the practical component of the course which is usually delivered over two days with approximate timings of 8.30am until 5pm on day one and 8.30am until 4pm on day two. Note that due to scenarios and participant's prior knowledge the completion time is variable.

ENTRY CRITERIA

Open entry as CIMS2 is incorporated into this CIMS4 course.

WHAT TO BRING
